#### Eligibility Criteria for BVU Law Entrance Exam

To be eligible for admission to 5 year LLB Degree course you should pass the HSC or equivalent examination with English as a subject. You need to obtain more than 40 % marks in aggregate from any recognized Board of India.

For the 3 years Degree course you should acquire the Bachelors Degree in any discipline from a recognized university. Moreover, you must secure more than 40 % marks in aggregate.

The cost of the Brochure is Rs.500 from the counter and Rs.600 by post. The Entrance Test Fee is Rs.500.

## About the Entrance Test

Separate set of question papers are provided to you for 3 year and 5 year degree course of LLB. The question paper contains 100 multiple choice questions divided into 4 sections of 25 questions each. You are tested on the following subjects: English Grammar, Usage & Comprehension, general knowledge, Legal aptitude, Analytical ability & logical reasoning and Indian Constitution and Political System in India.

## CLAT:

### About CLAT

CLAT was born out of need to have a common admission test across all the national law universities which will make it easier for the candidates. CLAT is a common examining forum that saves time and expenses that would have been required for appearing in several entrance exams for different law universities in India. Admission in 11 national law universities is through CLAT 2011.

### Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility is one big factor for the candidates sitting for the exams to undergraduate and postgraduate law programmes.

For those seeking admission to undergraduate programmes candidates must have cleared 10+2 or equivalent examination with a minimum of 50% marks. Candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC category have to score 45% marks.

A minimum of 55% marks in LLB or equivalent examination is essential for those sitting for the exams for postgraduate law programmes. 50% marks for SC/ST/OBC is held mandatory. It is to be noted that candidates appearing for their qualifying examinations in March/April 2011 can appear for CLAT- 2011.

## Applying for CLAT 2011

The application form along with the information brochure will be available from January 11, 2011 from the National Law Universities and post offices across India on payment of Rs.150.

You can send a Demand Draft/Bankers Cheque/Pay order of Rs. 200 in favour of “WBNUJS-CLAT A/C” payable at Kolkata to Convenor, Common Law Admission Test (CLAT-2011)

During the submission of the application forms, the candidates are required to drop in the form along with Demand Draft/Bankers Cheque/ Pay order of Rs. 2500 in favour of “WBNUJS-CLAT A/C”, payable at Kolkata.

The SC/ST candidates need to pay Rs. 2000. Every candidate needs to submit necessary documents as mentioned in the application form. You get the details on CLAT website ([www.clat.ac.in](http://www.clat.ac.in)). The forms need to be submitted between 10 am and 4 pm. on all working days either by registered post or by physically visiting any of the 11 centres. The form has to reach the concerned department by April 2, 2011.

## Examination Pattern

There will be different set of examination for different programs. CET LAW/LLB/LLM Entrance Exam test paper consists of 300 objective questions with multiple options. The test paper is divided into four parts.

Part I - comprises of 50 questions from Mental Ability.

Part II- comprises of 100 questions from General Knowledge and Current Affairs.

Part III- comprises of 100 questions from Aptitude for Law.

Part IV- comprises of 50 questions from General English.

Duration of CET LAW/LLB/LLM Entrance Exam is three hours. Each correct answer will fetch 4 marks to the candidate.

## Syllabus

GNDU CET LAW/LLB/LLM Entrance Exam has no particular set of syllabus. Questions asked for Three years LLB Law program are of graduation level, while questions asked for Five year BA.LLB (Hons) program and Five Year BA.LLB program are of 10+2 level.
